NATIONALLY RECOGNISED
TRAINING

Overview

General induction training is a structured training course of at least six (6) hours duration of face- to-face delivery. This can be extended, where necessary, to accommodate learning preferences or special learning needs. NT white cards will be accepted by all jurisdictions, including NT WorkSafe as evidence that induction training has been completed.

The Northern Territory Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work (the Code) commenced as an approved Code of Practice in the Northern Territory on 31 October 2009. The Code provides practical guidance to employers in the construction industry to assist in fulfilling their obligations around worker induction. The white card will be tangible evidence that the person has completed the approved training in accordance with the Code. The "National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work" (National Code) is incorporated into the NT Code. The NT Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work and the National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work is available on the NT WorkSafe website.

What is a Code of Practice?

An approved Code of Practice is a practical guide available to assist employers achieve the standard of safety required by the *Workplace Health and Safety Act 2007* and Regulations. For example, Regulation 43 uses words like 'suitable' and 'appropriate' and this Code of Practice illustrates what this requires in relation to construction induction training. An approved Code of Practice is designed to be used in conjunction with an Act and Regulation but does not have the same legal force. A Workplace Safety Officer may cite an approved Code of Practice in a direction or in an Improvement or Prohibition Notice, indicating the measures that should be taken to remedy an alleged contravention or non-compliance. Failure to comply with a requirement in an Improvement or Prohibition Notice is an offence. If you follow an approved Code of Practice, you can be confident that you will achieve the minimum standards required to meet your obligations under the associated Act and Regulations.

What is induction for construction work training?

General induction training in accordance with the NT Code provides persons entering the construction industry with a basic knowledge of requirements under the *Workplace Health and Safety Act*, the common hazards and risks likely to be encountered on construction sites and how these risks should be controlled.

My workers have already had induction

Employers should assess whether the training provided was appropriate and meets the requirements of the legislation.

I already have a white/blue card do I have to get a Territory one?

No, the cards are recognised nationally, providing the training has been done in accordance with the Code.

Do I / my workers still have to do the task and site induction training?

Yes, general construction induction training is only an induction into the industry. Employees must also do task and site specific induction training.
